## Testing Format

Competing students should meet at School of Business Building's atrium at 9:15 am for the Sprint Round. The team members will compete in separate rooms as the individuals. The procedures for each test will be presented by the Proctors. Those individuals that would like to take the Team test can do so as tests are available if they notify the Coordinator during registration, these will be for unofficial results only. The individual competitors not taking the Team test will report back to the School of Business Building's
atrium after the Target Round. The Countdown Round is a fast-paced one-on-one competition. If guests can only be at one part of the event, this is it. The rules for the Countdown Round will be presented to the students and audience. Please refer to the Mathcounts Handbook for rules. The Coordinator will make all decisions affecting the results of the competition.

## Student Supplies

Students are expected to provide their own pencils, erasers, and calculators. Scratch paper will be provided at the event.

## Food

Lunch will be provided for all registered students with a ticket at Alumni Dining Commons. You can bring your own, if you want. No food or drinks except bottled water will be allowed in the testing rooms. Food and drinks are available for purchase at Alumni Dining Commons for Coaches, Volunteers and Guests. The prices vary from $\$ 10$ to $\$ 12$ for lunch. Coaches and Guests that would like to drink coffee are encouraged to purchase it at Alumni Dining Commons, there are no coffee making facilities available in the School of Business Building's atrium.

## Countdown Round

The Countdown Round will pit the top 16 individual scorers against each other in a "Sweet 16 " format. The students will be competing only for awards and prizes. The results of the Countdown Round will not have an impact on advancement to State. If a student declines to compete, the next highest scorer will be allowed to compete.

## Coach/Guest Activities

Visitors typically socialize, read a book or solve math problems while testing takes place.

## What Coaches need to do prior to the competition

1. Send in Competitor Information via email to the Coordinator as soon as possible, no later than 10 days prior to the competition.
2. Provide students and guests the directions to CBU (available above).
3. Complete and sign the photo-video release form for each coach and student and turn in at the registration on competition day.
4. State and national competition dates will be announced later.

## What coaches need to do on the day of the competition

1. Make sure all students are registered and get student lunch tickets
2. Make sure students understand that Team Members and Individuals from the same school may be competing in different rooms.
3. Attend the coaches meeting at $8: 45 \mathrm{am}$.
4. Help make sure students get back into the rooms promptly after breaks
5. Stress that students are not to verbalize answers during the Countdown Round
6. Pick up your Tally Sheets after the awards ceremony
7. Pick up your State Packet, if advancing.
